	 A <u>verb tense</u> must match the time the verb's <u>action takes place</u>. A <u>shift in verb tense</u> is when the tenses in a text <u>change</u>. When the actions take place at the same time, a shift in tense is <u>inappropriate</u>. 		



CORRECT: My mom <u>made</u> pasta with turkey meatballs and we <u>ate</u> that for dinner.

CORRECT: My mom will make pasta with turkey meatballs and we will eat that for dinner.

INCORRECT: My mom **made** pasta with turkey meatballs and we **eat** that for dinner.
