TENSE CONSISTENCY

- A verb tense must match the time the verb's action takes place.
- A shift in verb tense is when the tenses in a text change.
- \cdot When the actions take place at the same time, a shift in tense is inappropriate.

No shift in verb tense	Yesterday we took(past) a bus to go to school but we walked(past) back home.
Inappropriate shift in verb tense	Yesterday we took(past) a bus to go to school but we will walk(future) back home.

Appropriate shift in verb tense	Tomorrow, I <u>will start</u> (future) early for my office.Yesterday, I <u>started(past)</u> late and <u>reached(past)</u> my office after 9:30a.m.
Incorrect verb	Tomorrow, I <u>will start</u> (future) early for my office.Yesterday, I <u>will start</u> (future) late and <u>will</u>
tense	<u>reach</u> (future) my office after 9:30a.m.
